Internship Selection Criteria

- Applicants must currently be enrolled in a doctoral (i.e., Ph.D. or PsyD) program in clinical, counseling, or school psychology.
- At this time, applicants will be considered from both APA- and non APA- accredited programs.
- Prior to the interview, if one is granted, applicants must have completed (1) at least three years of graduate coursework in their current field; (2) at least 500 hours of supervised practicum work; (3) all required doctoral course work; and (4) have successfully proposed their dissertation.
- Applicants with previous clinical experience with children, adolescents, and families, previous clinical experience working with those with trauma histories, and those interested in juvenile justice, forensic psychology and child maltreatment will be the best fit for the internship program.
- Applicants who are bilingual in English and Spanish and those underrepresented in psychology are especially encouraged to apply.

- If applicable, statement discussing how you and your program have adapted to changes in training opportunities due to COVID-19. Please discuss any changes to training opportunities and the accumulation of hours toward supervised practicum work.

- Curriculum Vitae
- APPIC Application for Psychology Internship (AAPI)
- Three letters of recommendation (one from the applicant's Director of Clinical Training and two others from clinical supervisors)
- De-identified intake report including case conceptualization and treatment recommendations

Applicants will be contacted to schedule an in-person interview as merited and as possible, given evolving COVID-19 precautions. If in-person interviews cannot be conducted, a series of interviews via Microsoft Teams, Zoom, GoToMeeting, or another similar platform will be conducted.
