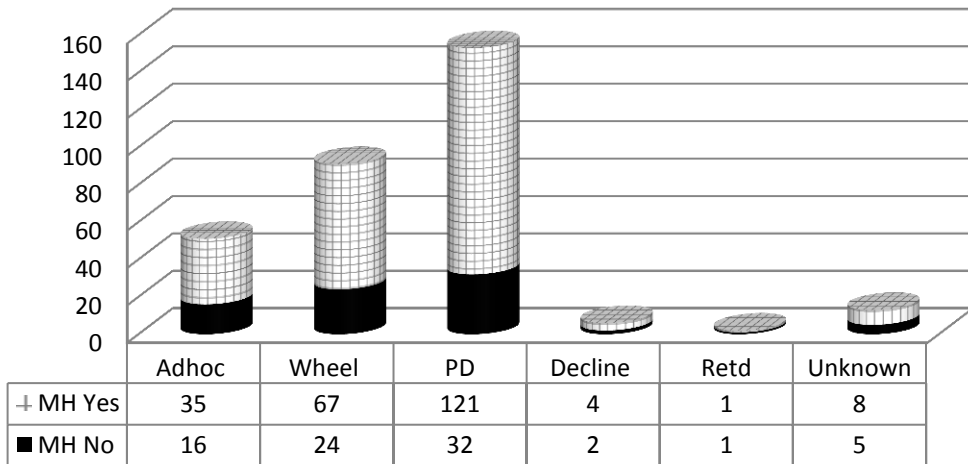




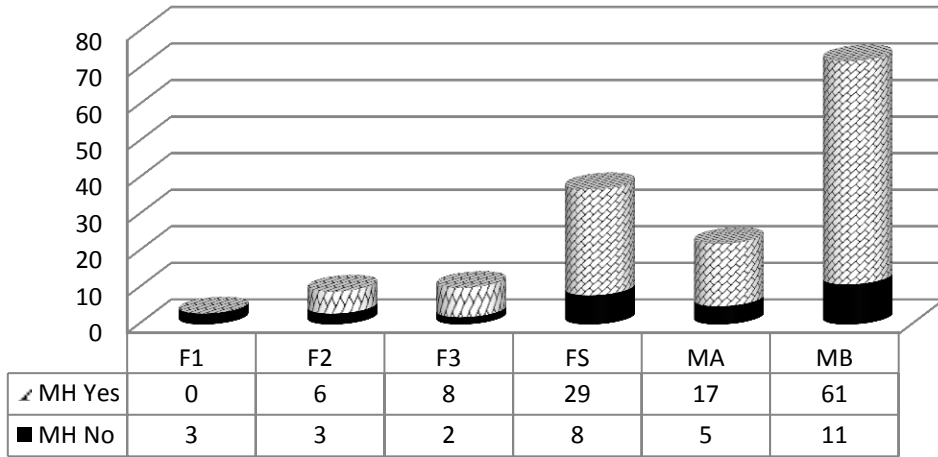
### Avg. Days in Jail



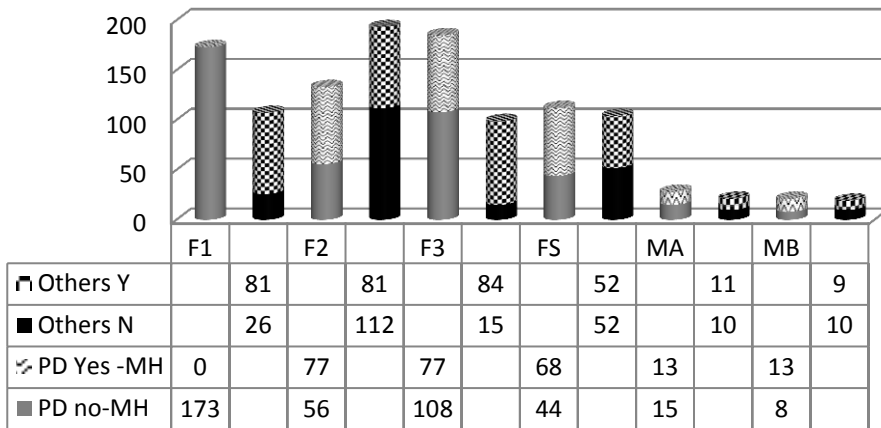
### Attorney Type
