Heat-related illnesses are preventable!

Drink plenty of water while outdoors.

Increase time spent in air-conditioned locations.

Limit outdoor activities, such as exercise, during peak daytime temperatures.

Never leave children in vehicles.

Limit alcohol when outdoors.

Take breaks while participating in outdoor activities.

Wear weather-appropriate clothing while outdoors.

Check on elderly neighbors and family members.
