Parkland had a majority- minority board from 2011 to 2013. The new Parkland Board is the first majority-minority board in 2 years.

Dallas County Judge Clay Jenkins has appointed Natalie Jenkins Sorrell to the Parkland Board of Managers.

“Natalie is a rising star in our community who brings a fresh perspective and an in depth knowledge of finance. She is a leader who will further strengthen a dynamic board,” said Jenkins.

Sorrell is the Director of Investments for the Employees’ Retirement Fund (EFR) of the City of Dallas. In this capacity, she is responsible for the design and implementation of the overall investment strategy and policy for the \$3.4 billion fund. She has more than 20 years of experience in finance ranging from mergers and acquisitions to investment banking in both the healthcare and finance sectors
