Currently on Election Day, voters must vote at their assigned precinct voting location. The goal, be-



ginning this election cycle, is to solve the confusion many voters experience on Election Day about where their assigned election precinct is. Improving access, increasing turnout as well as the efficiency of collecting and counting votes, is also a priority. If you are a resident of Dallas County, no matter where you live, work or go to school, you can cast your election day vote at any Voting Center or nearby polling location just like you can during early voting.
