

Commissioner Daniel Term as RTC Chair Ends

Dallas County Commissioner Dr. Theresa Daniel handed over the reins to the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) Regional Transportation Council (RTC) to Collin County Commissioner Duncan Webb at the June 9, 2022 meeting.

Webb takes over for Commissioner Theresa Daniel of Dallas County, who has chaired the RTC through its transition from virtual meetings to in-person gatherings during the COVID-19 pandemic. Dallas County Judge Clay Jenkins will be the next secretary. The new officers will serve in their positions through June 2023.

During her tenure, there was a renewed focus on air quality, equity in transportation planning and electric vehicles. The Council is also funding a number of automated vehicle projects across the metroplex that are planned to begin sometime in 2023. The Council will spend over \$30 million on nine different projects related to automated vehicle technology in various cities across the region as part of its long-term plans.

The Council is also putting together a regional parking database to help inform area officials on ways to develop more efficient parking. Using a 2018 study, the Council estimates potentially 40% of the region's parking spaces are typically unused.

A recent ribbon-cutting ceremony marked the launch of the Homeward Bound Dallas County Deflection Center which aims to curb homelessness and address mental health by keeping people out of area jails.

In Dallas, the Dallas County Jail is one of the main treatment centers for people with mental illnesses who are involved in the criminal justice system. The Dallas County Jail is the second largest mental health treatment facility in the state of Texas.

Dallas County Deflects will prevent individuals who are charged with certain low-level, non-violent misdemeanor offenses, such as criminal trespassing, from entering the criminal justice system. Treatment will reduce costs associated with repeatedly incarcerating individuals suffering from mental illness and reduce the number of emergency psychiatric visits from these individuals. Even brief periods in jail cause significant life challenges for people with mental illness such as jeopardizing employment opportunities, housing, and benefits.

Homeward Bound's facility is set to open for services on August 1, 2022.

Eviction Prevention and Recovery Resources

Eviction Diversion Program (EDP) & Housing Navigators (HN)

The Eviction Diversion Program (EDP) is a special program/court process that allows courts to place eviction lawsuits on hold and divert eviction proceedings. Under the EDP, payments are provided to landlords for rental arrears in exchange for allowing tenants to remain in their homes and forgiving late fees.

Housing Navigators (HN) are stationed in the respective Justice of the Peace (JP) courts to work closely with the respective JP courts, tenant eviction cases as well as the respective property owners and managers towards resolving the eviction cases through the Dallas County's EDP. Emergency Housing Assistance Program

The Emergency Housing Assistance Program - 2021 (EHAP - 2021) is to provide: Short-term rental, mortgage, and utility assistance to low income Dallas County residents living outside of the City of Dallas economically affected (loss/reduction of income) by the spread of COVID-19.

Applications will be processed through a lottery system. Effective July 1, 2021, applications will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis.

Dallas County Celebrates LGBTQ+ Pride Month June 2022





Dallas County celebrate June 2022 as LGBTQ+ Pride Month! A resolution honoring the past and looking to the future for the LGBTQ+ community was given by Commissioner Daniel on June 7, 2022 (text below) and several community members came to the Court to receive it and speak to the issues still facing the community (right.) Commissioner Daniel also sponsored the first "Lunch and Learn" featuring the events of the June 26, 2015 in Dallas County after the Supreme Court Obergefell v. Hodges decision granting the rights and privileges of marriage to samesex couples. Jack Evans and George Harris (above) were the first couple to be married after 55 years together by Judge Dennise Garcia with Rev. Eric Folkerth as their witness.

BE IT REMEMBERED, at a regular meeting of the Commissioners Court of Dallas County, Texas, held on the 7th day of June 2022 on a motion made by Dr. Theresa M. Daniel, Commissioner of District 1 and seconded by Dr. Elba Garcia, Commissioner of District 4, the following Resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, June is recognized as Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ+) Pride Month commemorating the rebellion at the Stonewall Inn in New York City. The rebellion began on June 28, 1969 in opposition to police harassment and what followed marked the beginning of the modern LGBTQ+ rights movement; and

WHEREAS, Individuals who are LGBTQ+ live in every neighborhood in Dallas County, and are from all faiths, races, national origins, socioeconomic statuses, education levels, employment fields and political beliefs; and

WHEREAS, The fight for equality has taken many paths. A significant one is through the legal system. One, Inc. v. Olesen (1958), was the first U.S. Supreme Court case that involved gay rights, marked a triumphant moment for the emerging liberation movement establishing the right to free speech. In Romer v. Evans (1996) the Supreme Court ruled that laws couldn't single out LGBTQ+ people to take away their rights. In Lawrence v. Texas (2003), Justice Kennedy delivered the decision stating that '[I]iberty presumes an autonomy of self that includes freedom of thought, belief, and expression" and that the due process clause of the 14th Amendment protects "the full right to engage in private conduct without government intervention" "into the individual's personal and private life." In United States v. Windsor (2013) the Supreme Court ruled that the Defense of Marriage Act violates due process and equal protection principles; and

WHEREAS, This month we celebrate the 7th anniversary of the historic Obergefell v. Hodges ruling issued June 26th, 2015, where the Supreme Court held that same-sex couples are guaranteed the fundamental right to marriage on the same terms and conditions as different sex couples under the Due Process Clause and the Equal Protection Clause; and

WHEREAS, In the wake of the leaked draft of the Supreme Court's intention to overturn *Roe v. Wade*, the draft's provocative rhetoric is generating concern that LGBTQ+ advances and other matters based on the right to privacy could be vulnerable. Cases like *Lawrence v. Texas*, and *Obergefell v. Hodges*, are based at least in part on that same right to privacy. The draft opinion also signals that the court is willing to disturb significant legal precedent which could have consequences beyond the immediate overturning of the decision; and


WHEREAS, Attorneys for LGBTQ+ advocacy organizations say that if the language is final, it opens a Pandora's box for rolling back some of the most fundamental American rights guaranteed in the 14th Amendment. As proof of the current contentious climate, the last Texas legislative session saw an unprecedented number of over 75 of anti-LGBTQ+ bills filed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Dallas County is committed to being supportive and welcoming of the LGBTQ+ community. And the Dallas County Commissioners Court does hereby proclaim the month of June 2022 as LGBTQ+ Pride Month in Dallas County.
