WHEREAS,

The Dallas County Commissioners Court likes to take special notice whenever someone leads

with vision and unwavering commitment to Dallas County families and residents; and

WHEREAS,

Judge Tena Callahan and Associate Judge Christine Collie of the 302<sup>nd</sup> Family District Court saw a way to improve the criminal justice system on behalf of families and children in Dallas County. One such improvement was to establish the Legacy Family Court which was proposed to the Dallas County Commissioners Court and approved in November 2011 and officially began

operating in May 2012; and

WHEREAS,

The purpose of the Legacy Family Court of Dallas County is to bring families back together and help them achieve a new beginning and sense of purpose by committing to supervised recovery and rehabilitation. Families who enter the Department of Families and Protective Services receive systematic support services with the ultimate goal of reunification with their children;

The first participant of the Legacy Family court was admitted in October 2012. To date, the Legacy Family Court has had a total of twenty-four participants and held four graduations, with three more graduations scheduled to take place in 2015. The Legacy Family Court is pleased that hard work and perseverance has resulted in seven children reunited with their parents; and

In recognition of their efforts, Judge Tena Callahan and Associate Judge Christine Collie received the "Agent of Change Award" on behalf of the Legacy Family Court of Dallas County. This is an annual award presented from the Dallas Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse at its annual Power of Prevention Luncheon which occurred on October 22, 2015.
