Preserving History in the City of Garland, Dallas County

BE IT REMEMBERED, that the Dallas County Commissioners Court, congratulates the Interurban Land Company's Travis College Hill Historic District for being the only Garland neighborhood ever to receive a Texas Historical Marker on this 11th day of April, 2015, on motion made by Dr. Theresa M. Daniel, the following Resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS,	The	Texas	Historical	Commission	has	designated the	Travis College
				Cart at the first	-		100

Hill Addition to receive a historical marker for 1915; and

WHEREAS, The Dallas County Historical Commission was the sponsor of Travis

College Hill's application to receive a Texas Historical Marker; and

WHEREAS, The area along South 11th Street between Avenues B and D in

Garland, which originated 102 years ago as part of the Interurban Land Company's Travis College Hill Addition, was officially platted on January 3, 1913, has five historic homes, and is the new home to the

relocated historic Pace House; and

WHEREAS, The two-block area has, in its history, been the home of three Garland

mayors, five city council members, one president of the Garland Independent School District, as well as some of the city's best-known

business, civic, political, and religious leaders; and

WHEREAS, Last May 20 the Garland City Council voted unanimously to designate

the Travis College Hill neighborhood as Garland's first historic district.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that on behalf of the Dallas County Commissioners Court, I commend the residents of the Travis College Hill neighborhood for their efforts to preserve the neighborhood's rich history and the restoration of its historic homes.
