**BE IT REMEMBERED,** at a regular meeting of the Commissioners Court of Dallas County, Texas, held on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of June, 2016, on a motion made by <u>Dr. Theresa M. Daniel, Commissioner of District 1</u>, and seconded by Dr. Elba Garcia, Commissioner of District 4 , the following Resolution was adopted:

**WHEREAS**, the right to counsel is guaranteed in both the United States Constitution and the Texas Constitution, and, as such, is not a discretionary program; and

**WHEREAS**, The *Texas Fair Defense Act of 2001* was developed by the Texas legislature to provide a necessary structure and guidance to local officials; and

WHEREAS, the State of Texas is required to implement this right and provide legal counsel to indigent criminal defendants and fund the costs associated with the *Texas Fair Defense Act of 2001*; and

**WHEREAS**, in the 15 years since the Fair Defense Act was passed, the State has never covered more than 20% of the costs of providing indigent criminal defense; and

WHEREAS, indigent defense is one of the major uncontrollable costs in a budget because there is no control over the number of defendants who must be represented at a level of quality that meets the minimum standards imposed by the law; and

WHEREAS, Dallas County costs have increased more than 73% from \$16 million in 2001 to \$28 million in 2015 with only 7% of this increased expense covered by the state, thereby shifting the burden of costs to the Dallas County taxpayers; and

**WHEREAS**, With 17% of Texans falling below the poverty line, the 8<sup>th</sup> highest rank in the United States, the number of indigent criminal defendants is expected to keep growing; and

**WHEREAS**, the Texas legislature has taken steps toward closing this funding gap, there is still much more work to be done.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Dallas County Commissioners Court asks the Texas legislature to fully fund the cost of indigent criminal defense throughout the state and in Dallas County as mandated by the *Fair Defense Act of 2001*.
