BE IT REMEMBERED, at a regular meeting of the Commissioners Court of Dallas County, Texas, held on the 2nd day of March, 2021, on a motion made by <u>Dr. Theresa M. Daniel, Commissioner of District 1</u>, and seconded by <u>John Wiley Price, Commissioner District 3</u>, the following Resolution was adopted:

- WHEREAS, Marsha Jackson is a Dallas County native and resident in good standing; and
- WHEREAS, Marsha Jackson and her family are living legacies of a long, proud, and distinguished history of Black trial riding clubs and Black cowboy culture in Southern Dallas County; and
- WHEREAS, Marsha Jackson has sacrificed countless hours helping North Texas residents in need as a local Red Cross volunteer; and
- WHEREAS, Marsha Jackson has been relentless in her pursuit of the clean-up of the illegal hazardous waste dump known as "Shingle Mountain" that first appeared in her backyard without warning in 2017; and
- WHEREAS, Marsha Jackson's efforts have made her a national hero of the environmental justice movement, admired by advocates locally and throughout the U.S., and the subject of numerous articles and reports including the Washington Post and Philadelphia Inquiry; and
- WHEREAS, After years of advocacy and organizing by Marsha Jackson the Shingle Mountain dump is now being remediated, and the land is slated by the neighborhood for use as a park; and
- WHEREAS, Marsha Jackson has been a steadfast advocate for her Flora Farms community, leading the drafting of the first neighborhood plan written by Southern Dallas residents, and written in Spanish as well as English; and
- WHEREAS, Marsha Jackson and her struggle to rebuild her community is featured in the premiere of the Black Entertainment Network's hour-long documentary series, "Disrupt and Dismantle," hosted by Soledad O'Brien, airing nationally Sunday, February 21st at 8 pm; and
- WHEREAS, This BET documentary is only the latest example of how Marsha Jackson's dedication to environmental justice has reverberated through the US; and
- WHEREAS, We further would like to wish Marsha Jackson Happy Birthday as she will celebrate that also on February 22, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Dallas County Commissioners Court, does hereby declare Monday, February 22nd as "Marsha Jackson Day" in honor of her fierce commitment to environmental justice and health, and for her dedication to her community
