National 4-H Week "Celebrating Opportunity 4 All"

WHEREAS,

The Dallas County Commissioners Court is proud to honor the 4-H Youth Development Program of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service for 116 years of youth development. This year's National 4-H Week theme, "I love 4-H," reminds us of the millions of people and the multiple generations who have advanced and succeeded because of the opportunity to participate in the largest youth organization in the nation. 4-H recognizes that every child has valuable strengths that they can use to improve the world around them. So, this year we celebrate the sense of responsibility, awareness, and equity for ALL members of the community. 4-H, "Head, Heart, Hands, and Health," aspires to help Dallas youth acquire the knowledge, life skills, and attitudes that will propel them to become self-directed, productive, and contributing members of our society; and

WHEREAS,

This admirable program seeks to provide a positive learning experience to more than five thousand youth of all backgrounds across the four districts in Dallas County over the next two years. Dallas County 4-H connects with youth by establishing community and school clubs, special interest groups and camps. The Teens as Teachers workforce program, the Dallas Leadership -group, and the CLOVER online educational platform are new opportunities for youth to work on their civic engagement skills and to work on bridging the disparity gaps that exist in their communities; and

In Dallas County, 4-H programs are delivered by AgriLife Extension and Prairie View Cooperative Extension. Dallas County 4-H programs have provided life-changing experiences to hundreds of young people, and with the support of caring adult volunteers, students have taken on critical societal issues.
