
R&B 4 Works Hard To Keep Us Safe During Winter Storm

Dallas County Soon To Offer Marriage Licenses Online

Tying the knot? Dallas County will soon accept marriage applications online. We approved a contract for \$32,000 for software to allow remote marriage applications. Those looking to marry can submit applications at any time and attend an appointment with the County Clerk's Office virtually on any device. Applicants will be asked several questions, be required to upload supporting documents such as form of identification, schedule a follow-up appointment and enter payment options, all online. With the exception of military applicants, both parties have to be on camera together with their proof of identification for the appointment. Applicants will have to pay an additional \$10 convenience fee for online applications, making the total cost \$92 to submit an application.

National Recognition For Parkland Hospital's Maternity Care Team




Parkland was recognized by the U.S. News & World Report as a top North Texas hospital for maternity care in 2022. The report surveyed 650 hospitals across the country to determine the top hospital. Factors like C-section rates in

lower-risk pregnancies, newborn complication rates, breast milk feeding, and early elective delivery rates all impact recognition. Hospitals were also recognized for their recorded data about outcomes based on race and ethnicity. "Parkland hospital delivers 12,000 babies a year, one of the highest rates in the country, and many of its patients are uninsured. Despite the obstacles, 97% of patients who deliver at Parkland receive prenatal care," according to Marjorie Quint-Bouzid, Parkland's senior vice president for Women and Infant's Specialty Health.


University of St. Augustine for Health Sciences (USAHS) Dallas Campus
