According to the Texas Department of Health & Human Services, in 2023, an estimated 20,510 women and 191 men in Texas will be diagnosed with breast cancer, and an estimated 3,503 women and 32 men will die from it. Commissioner Garcia encourages everyone to be proactive in staying healthy by getting screened now to be informed, to prevent, to treat and to understand those who are going through the different levels of this disease.

OCTOBER IS domestic violence awareness month

According to the Texas Advocacy Project, 1 in 3 Texans will experience domestic violence in their lifetime. Girls and young women between the ages of 16 and 24 experience the highest rate of intimate partner violence, almost triple the national average. 1 in 4 women and 1 in 13 men reported being a victim of stalking in their lifetime. More than 1 in 3 women and more than 1 in 4 men in the United States have experienced rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner in their lifetime. 33% of sexual assaults are committed by a current or former intimate partner. A recent meta-analysis has shown that domestic violence incidents increased by 8.1% after jurisdictions-imposed pandemic-related lockdown orders. Protective orders are as much as 80% effective in reducing future violence.
