## Common Sense Steps to Starting Your Business

Determine what product or service will be sold
Perform market research (Site selection, demographic analysis, etc.)
Investigate your insurance options – know your top 5 liabilities
Determine a pricing strategy for the product or service
Complete a Feasibility Study (Help you determine the price point to make your business profitable)
Develop your written business concept – 25 words or less (Be clear and focused)
Become an expert in your industry
Name your business (Choose a name that the public likes, not what you like)
Make your business legal with the proper filings and operating procedures according to law
Implement your plan (Know and plan how you want opening day to flow)
Set up a business banking account (Don't use a personal banking account)
Get a sales tax permit from the Texas Comptroller's Office
Secure other legal permits or license(s) that apply to your business
Write the business plan
Raise working capital
Consult with a business attorney, CPA, and two bankers
Develop a timeline of events from date of idea to actual opening
Obtain an EIN (Employer Identification Number) from the IRS
