## TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER IDENTIFYING ESSENTIAL PERSONNEL IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19 EMERGENCY

On March 24, 2020 the Mental Illness Court, pursuant to directives of the Texas Supreme Court, Texas Office of Court Administration, and Dallas County Judge, is restricting operations to essential functions until April 3, 2020 out of an abundance of caution to reduce the number of gatherings in close quarters due to the COVID-19 virus.
