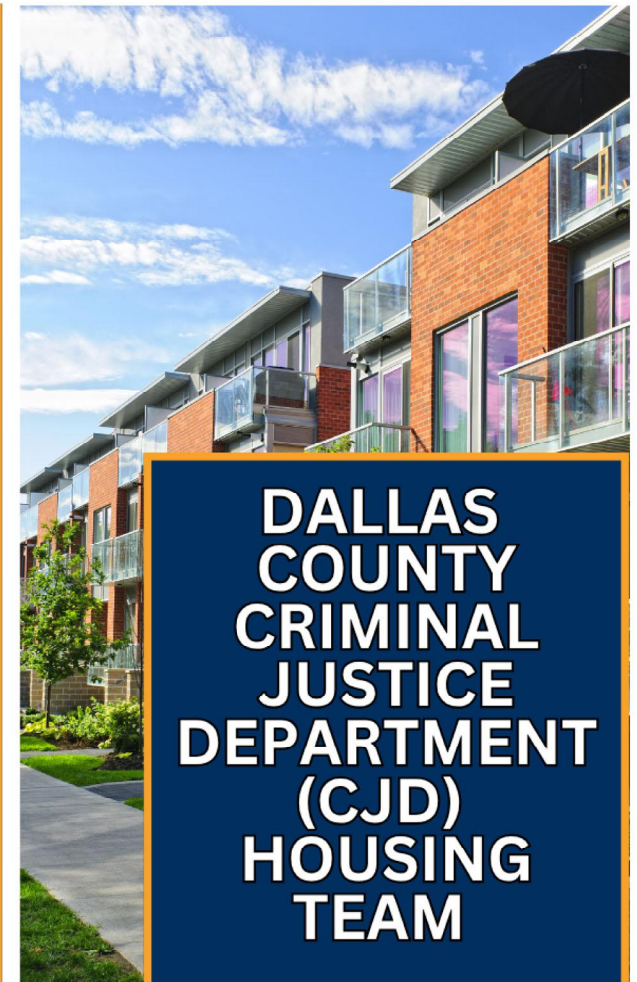

The Dallas County Criminal Justice Department (CJD) housing team is responsible for connecting our releasing and specialty court self-reporting unsheltered/homeless neighbors to housing and reentry support services.

Our team diligently works to create innovative community partnerships that help our neighbors successfully transition into society and receive essential support services to become self-sufficient and productive citizens.

Our collaborations focus on giving our neighbors hope and confidence to build meaningful lives.

Frequent User System Enhancement (FUSE) Program

The Frequent Users System Enhancement (FUSE) project focuses on assisting frequent jail utilizers who self-report homelessness/unshelteredness to secure housing support and wrap-around services with a local shelter partner to work toward self-sufficiency and permanent housing placement.

This is a collaborative partnership with the Bridge, Austin Street Shelter, the Salvation Army, the Dallas Deflection Center, Parkland Hospital, the North Texas Behavioral Health Authority (NTBHA), and the Dallas County Criminal Justice Department.

Eligibility Requirements Include

- 18+ years old
- Self-reporting unsheltered/homeless individuals
- Two Low Sterrett County Jail bookings within the previous four years
- No Sex Offenders

Housing Services for Homeless Criminal Justice Involved Clients (HSJ-CJC) Program

The Housing Services for Homeless Criminal Justice Involved Clients (HSJ-CJC) is a partnership with local a boarding home provider.

The program is geared toward individuals who need higher levels of care (i.e., Outpatient or Inpatient Mental Health/Rehab Treatment Services) and those who would benefit from being housed in a smaller setting.

Eligibility Requirements Include

- 18+ years old
- Self-reporting unsheltered/homeless individuals
- At least One Low Sterrett County Jail bookin
- Sex Offenders will be eligible based on vacancies

The St. Jude Project

The Dallas County Criminal Justice Department partners with Catholic Charities of Dallas St Jude Project, which reconstructs vacant buildings (i.e., hotels) to permanent supportive housing units to house our unsheltered neighbors.

The Dallas County Criminal Justice Department currently partners with them at their Forest Lane location and sends our eligible releasing neighbor referrals to be considered for housing based on vacancies.

Eligibility Requirements Include

- 55+ years old
- Self-reporting unsheltered/homeless individuals
- Two Low Sterrett County Jail bookings within the previous two years
- No Sex Offenders
