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For Immediate Release: Dallas DA's Office Announces Indictments of Officers Involved in Summer 2020 Protests

(Dallas, Texas) – After nearly two years of investigation, Dallas County Criminal District Attorney John Creuzot announces a Dallas County Grand Jury has returned indictments on multiple police officers charged in connection to the Summer 2020 Protests in Downtown Dallas in the wake of the death of George Floyd.

The Dallas County District Attorney's Office presented the cases to the Grand Jury on May 4, 2022. After reviewing all evidence, the Grand Jury found there is probable cause to indict the officers in connection to events that occurred on the afternoon and evening of May 30, 2020.

 1 Indictment of Aggravated Assault by a Public Servant F2200221 These indictments as returned by the Grand Jury are the result of almost 2 years of investigation by the Dallas Police Department and the Dallas County District Attorney's Office. In cases where bonds have not been posted, warrants for arrest will be issued.
