When your last name is called, go up to the Bench in front of the Judge and hand him/her a copy of your Divorce Decree.

You will be asked to raise your right hand to be sworn-in. Give the following testimony if it is true and correct: _____, I am the Petitioner in this case. I am representing "Your Honor, my name is _ myself in Court today." "I have been a resident and domiciliary of Dallas County for 6 months preceding the filing of this divorce case." "The Respondent and I were married on the _____ day of ____, (year)__, and we separated and ceased to live together on or about the ____day of ____, (year)__." "The marriage has become insupportable because of discord or conflict of personalities between the parties that has destroyed the legitimate ends of the marriage relationship. There is no expectation of reconciliation." IF THERE ARE NO CHILDREN OF THE MARRIAGE: "There are no children born of this marriage, and none are adopted, and none are expected at this time." IF THERE ARE CHILDREN OF THIE MARRIAGE: "There are ____ children born of this marriage." *** (At this time, you will explain to the Court what provisions you have set forth concerning Conservatorship of the child(ren), i.e. Joint Managing Conservatorship or Sole and Possessory Conservatorship.) ***(At this time you will explain to the Court what provisions you have set forth concerning Visitation of the child(ren); i.e. Standard Visitation per the Texas Family Code.) ***(At this time you will explain to the Court what provisions you have set forth concerning Child Support for the child(ren) to be withheld by payroll withholding; i.e. how much per month.) "The parties have divided all of the community property, personal property, assets and debts as stated in the Decree of Divorce before Your Honor at this time." IF YOU ARE ASKING FOR A NAME CHANGE: "I ask that Your Honor restore my former name of _____ "I ask that Your Honor grant this Divorce. Thank you."
