The objective of the Communicable Disease Control program is to monitor the incidence of communicable diseases within the County and coordinate treatment programs and action plans in the event of an epidemic or centralized outbreak of disease.

Key Services

The division conducts comprehensive surveillance to detect and monitor outbreaks of diseases such as tuberculosis, influenza, HIV/AIDS, and foodborne illnesses. The division provides epidemiological support such as pandemics. Additionally, the division provides diagnostic services and epidemiological investigations to identify sources and transmission patterns.
