



Dallas County Health and Human Services 2021–2022 Influenza Surveillance Report

Week 3 ending January 22, 2022

Epidemiologic Summary

- Influenza activity remains low in Dallas County with 1.5 % of tests returning positive during week 3.
- Six Influenza-associated hospitalizations were reported during week 3.
- One influenza-associated death of an adult was reported in week 44. No influenza-associated pediatric deaths have been reported during the 2021-2022 season in Dallas County.
- RSV continues to circulate locally, although activity has declined.

Deaths occurring outside of influenza season require a positive PCR result in order to meet laboratory criteria. Positive RIDT will meet laboratory criteria after the start of flu season.

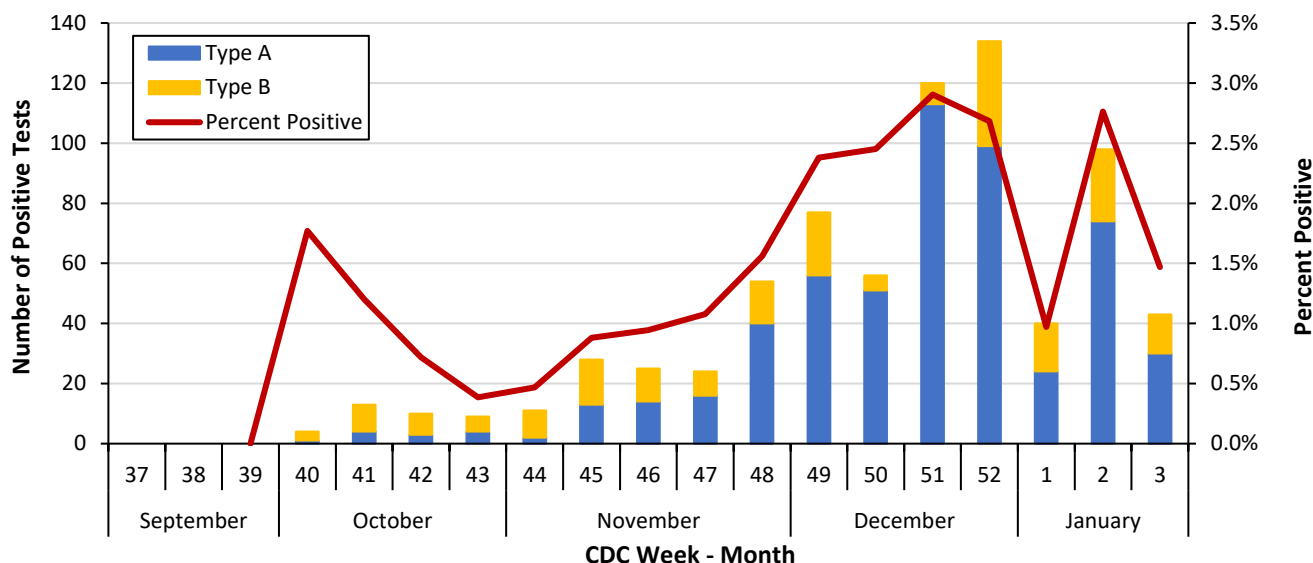
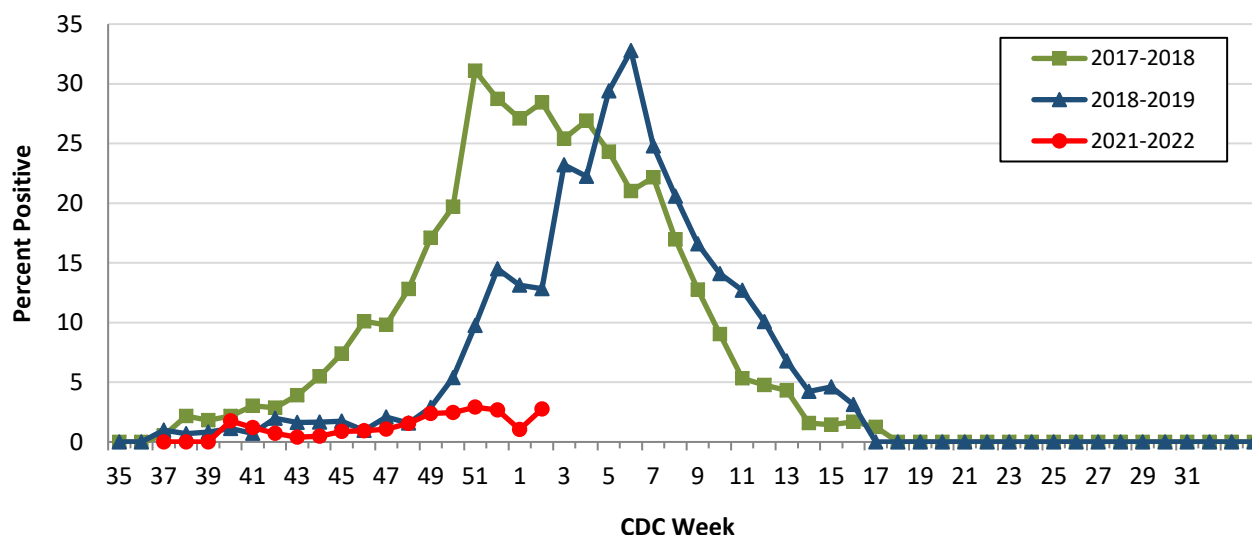

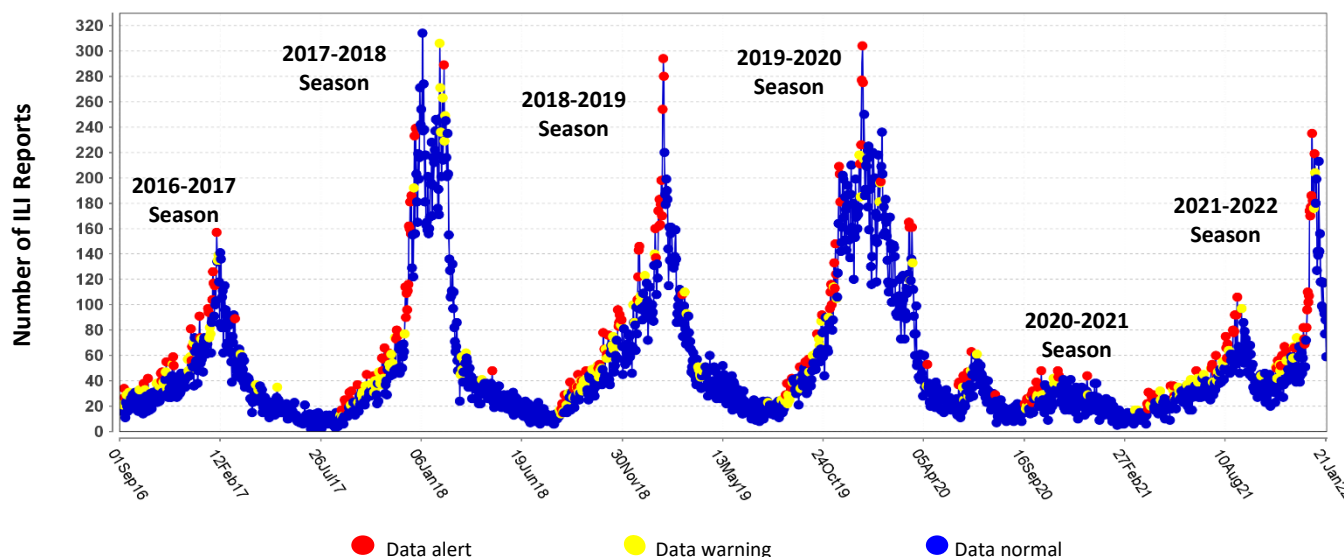

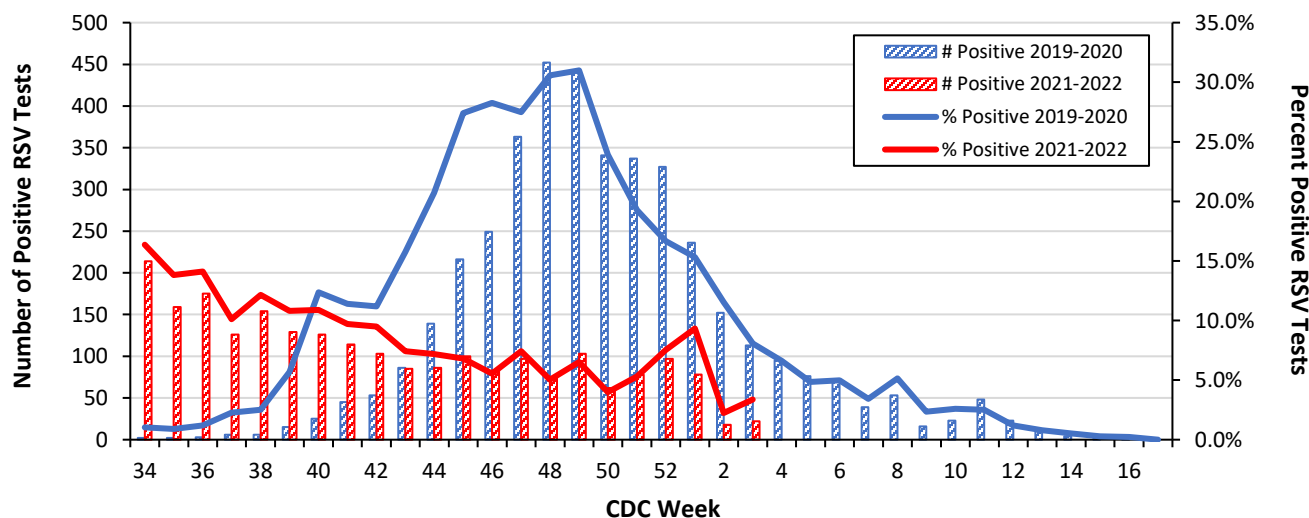

- Suspected influenza infections involving institutional outbreaks or a resident of any **Long Term Care facility** (please report *immediately*).

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
