In the blink of an eye. An opioid overdose response guide.

Know the Signs:













Unconscious or unable to wake up

slow, shallow, or no breathing

Vomiting or gurgling sounds

Limp body

Pinpoint pupils

Pale, blue, or cold skin (especially lips and fingernails)

How to Respond:

Try to wake the person up. Shake them and shout.
If no response, grind your knuckles into their breast bone for 5-10 seconds.

Call 911. Provide
them with as
much information
as possible
including the
person's condition
and exact
location.

Administer nasal Narcan (Naloxone). Tilt the person's head back, insert the nozzle into one nostril, and press the plunger.

If trained, perform CPR if the person is not breathing.

Administer another dose of Narcan after 2-3 minutes if the person is still not responding.

Stay with them until first responders arrive*.
