

Job Summary

Performs licensed peace officer tasks in accordance with State and local laws and the policies and procedures of the Constable's Office and performs bailiff tasks for the Justice of the Peace.

Required Documents

- A copy of a valid Texas Driver's License
- Completion of an online application in its entirety on Dallas County's Employment Site
- A copy of college transcript(s), if applicable
- A copy of your DD214, if military experience is going to be substituted
- Must possess a TCOLE Peace Officers License

Special requirements

Must be at least 21 years of age and possess a valid Driver's License with a good driving record. Must be a U.S. Citizen. Must have never been convicted of an offense above the grade of a Class B misdemeanor or a Class B Misdemeanor within the last ten years. Never convicted of any family violence offense. Not prohibited by state of federal law from operating a motor vehicle. Not prohibited by state or federal law from possessing firearms or ammunition. *Candidates who pass the written examination must pass a physical readiness test for further consideration.

Qualifications

- Must have successfully maintained commissioning requirements (Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standard and Education) TCOLE certification as a Peace Officer and one of the following:
- Thirty (30) hours of college from an accredited college or university with a grade "C" or better in each class and one year of law enforcement experience OR
- Two (2) fifteen (15) hours of college from an accredited college or university with a grade "C" or better in each class and two (2) years of law enforcement experience OR
- Three (3) years of law enforcement experience

Candidates must meet all minimum eligibility requirements by the close of the registration period, No exceptions will be made
