Job Summary: Performs licensed peace officer tasks in accordance with State and local laws and the policies and procedures of the Constable's Office and performs bailiff tasks for the Justice of the Peace.

Qualifications: The minimum requirements for the examination are as follows:

TCOLE (Texas Commission on Law Enforcement) certification as a Peace Officer *and one* of the following combinations: (1) thirty hours of college from an accredited college or university with a grade "C" or better in each class and one year of law enforcement experience; OR (2) fifteen hours of college from an accredited college or university with a grade "C" or better in each class and two years of law enforcement experience; OR (3) three years of law enforcement experience.

- Not prohibited by state or federal law from operating a motor vehicle.
- Not prohibited by state or federal law from possessing firearms or ammunition.
