

SMALL CLAIMS FILED IN JP 4-1 - Common Questions

ALL PETITIONS MUST BE ELECTRONICALLY FILED THROUGH E-FILE TEXAS OR EFILE SELF-HELP.

Where can I file a Small Claims Case?

You can file in any Justice court, however, if you file in the wrong location, then either party can have the case moved to the correct location. (Precinct map can be found on Dallas County Constable's website, there are 10 courts in Dallas County)

Do I need an attorney to file a Civil Action?

You can represent yourself or choose to obtain an attorney.

How can I file my Small Claim Case?

The first step in filing a case is to file a petition, which is a form that says who you are suing, why you are suing them, how much you are suing them for, and provides contact information.

- Justice of the Peace **4-1** accepts petitions electronically **only** via E-file Self-Help, or E-File Texas. *Forms and more information can be found on JP 4-1 court website.*
- Justice of the Peace **4-2** is in the same building. You may contact them at 214-589-7000 for more information about filing a case with their court.
- Both courts are assigned to precinct 4.

What are the costs to file a Small Claims case?

Filing fee is **\$54.00** plus service fees.

Choose 1 option.

- \$80.00 constable service fee per defendant (address within Dallas County)
- \$18.91 for certified mail per defendant.
- Private process server fees vary, and you pay that agency you choose for service.
- *If you cannot afford the filing fees and service fees, you may fill out a Statement of Inability to Afford Payment of Court Costs form. This form can be provided upon request.*

What if I have legal questions regarding my situation?

The court cannot provide you legal advice or direct you how to proceed with your case. You may obtain legal counsel or contact a free legal service provider. Phone numbers are provided on court website.

What if I can't make it to my hearing?

A motion for continuance must be submitted at least three (3) business days prior to the hearing, or it may not be considered by judge. **ALL hearings require in person appearances due to the possible complexity of each case and in fairness to all parties.**

What happens if I miss my hearing?

If the plaintiff fails to appear for their pretrial hearing/mediation or bench trial the case may be dismissed. If the defendant fails to appear for the hearings above, the plaintiff may seek a default judgment against the defendant if Judge determines plaintiff provided sufficient evidence.

Justice of the Peace 4-1 (Key Points)

•**All hearings require in-person appearances.** If you cannot appear in person for your case, you may contact another court before filing your case to obtain their policies for virtual appearances.

•**Filing fee: \$54.00 + Service fee per Defendant (choose 1):**

- Dallas County Constable service fee \$80.00 (address within Dallas County)
- Certified mail fee: \$18.91
- Private process service fee: You pay the agency you choose for service.

If you cannot afford costs, you may file a Statement of Inability to Afford Costs with your filing (for 1st and 2nd service option). This is subject to review by judge.

Miscellaneous filings:

- Filings other than Petition may be electronically filed through E-File Texas, or emailed to the court at JP41Civil@dallascounty.org (if there is no filing fee). **Some services requested may require a fee and must be submitted via E-file Texas, or in person.**
- A copy of the filing should be provided to the other party.

Motion for Continuance:

- Must be filed at least three (3) business days prior to hearing.
- If not timely filed, may not be considered by Judge.
- **It is recommended to include/attach supporting documentation with motion.**
- If granted, you are approved for that hearing only - does NOT include all future hearings.

Motion to Appear Virtually:

- All hearings require in-person appearances. If any party has a disability and/or needs accommodation to appear virtually, please submit supporting documentation with the motion.
- If virtual appearance is granted, you are approved for that hearing only - it does NOT include all future hearings.

If parties reach a settlement/agreement.

If parties reach an agreement a final disposition form, such as an agreed judgment or dismissal, may be filed. A notice of settlement or payment plan will not close the case. If you need a template, contact the court. A form may be available.
