Cultural Humility in Health Care

Traditional approaches to cultural competency integrate information about individuals into culturally appropriate interactions, treatments, protocols, and standards. Delivering culturally competent care includes efforts like connecting individuals with healthcare providers who have a similar culture or incorporating culture into the clinical environment, such as diverse images of people, flags representing the community's cultures, and culturally reflective brochures and waiting room literature.

While this traditional approach to culturally competent care incorporates many aspects of a person's culture, it has inherent biases. First, it draws from traits and experiences at the group level, rather than acknowledging individuality. Second, it generally positions certain traits (often white and heterosexual) as the "norm" and others as alternatives, rather than seeing them as equal, parallel traits. Finally, it suggests that there is an endpoint where one is totally culturally competent. Based on research and experience in the field, providers in all health-related environments to incorporate some of the following best practices:

- Ask About Identity First
- Disease Is Not the Only Issue
- Listen More Than You Speak
- Reflect on Your Own Identity

The United States Conference HIV/AIDS' purpose was to feature sessions on the updated National HIV/AIDS The conference Strategy. was an opportunity for health departments, community-based organizations, people living with HIV, people taking preexposure prophylaxis (PrEP), national organizations, medical centers, health care providers, donors, activists, and federal leaders to come together to discuss its implementation.





This year's theme was Luchando Por Nuestras Vidas: Fighting for Our Lives. USCHA was brought to Puerto Rico to highlight the impact of HIV in Puerto Rico and Latinx populations. USCHA made a promise to hold the conference in Puerto Rico after the devastation of Hurricane Maria and remained committed to assisting with the economic recovery.





Members of the RWPC Leadership team enjoyed meaningful fellowship, informative seminars, and engaging plenary sessions discussing important topics pertaining to HIV/AIDS.

The Afiya Center (TAC) was established in response to the increasing disparities between HIV incidences worldwide and the extraordinary prevalence of HIV among Black womxn and girls in Texas. TAC is unique in that it is the only Reproductive Justice (RJ) organization in North Texas founded and directed by Black womxn. At TAC we are transforming the lives, health, and overall wellbeing of Black womxn and girls by providing refuge, education, and resources; we act to ignite the communal voices of Black womxn resulting in our full achievement of reproductive freedom.



The Ryan White Planning Council is a community group that has been appointed by the County Judge, to plan the organization and delivery of HIV services for the Dallas EMA, HSDA funded by Part A, MAI Part B, & State Services of the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Extension Act.
