



The Compliance team reviews inmate grievances and conducts unannounced and quarterly inspections of our jail facilities to ensure the department is in compliance with the Texas Commission on Jail Standards.

Together, these facilities can house more than 6,000 inmates with a detention staff of 1,436 employees. The Dallas County detention facilities are self-sufficient and operate 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

The Technical Services Bureau is comprised of central intake, release, classification, The Jesse Everett Gill and Dr. Onesimo Hernandez Medical Facility, and special hospital oberservation team (S.H.O.T.).

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT DIVISION

The Resource Development Division is made up of the following Sections:

- o Training Academy
- o Gun Range
- o Personnel Section

These sections work together to **recruit, hire, train, and document certifications** to the state for all departmental personnel. The new Sheriff's
Department Training Academy opened on June 14, 2021.

The Dallas County Sheriff's Department graduated 24 new Deputy-Sheriff's. This requires 887 hrs. of training and rigorous studying to pass the Basic Peace Officer Course. To become a sworn deputy, it takes six months.

In 2021, we also welcomed 278 Detention Service Officers. This required passing a state licensing exam of 100 questions. This course takes four weeks.

ENFORCEMENT OPERATIONS

The Freeway Management Division deputies respond to calls of service related to freeway crashes, stalled vehicles, and assisting other police agencies. They are also tasked to respond to 911 calls made in the unicorparted areas of Dallas County.

o Patrol

The Dallas County Sheriff's Office patrols 14 unincorporated areas in Dallas County. Some of our popular neighborhoods include Bear Creek, Rock Creek, Pecan Lake, and Sand Branch.

o In **2020 & 2021**, Patrol answered **20,293** calls for service in the unincorporated areas.

o Traffic

- o Responded to 4,788 minor crashes and 2,548 major crashes in 2020
- o Responded to 5,281 minor crashes and 2,153 major crashes in 2021

INTELLIGENCE AND CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION BUREAU

The Investigative Bureau is made up of the Criminal Investigation Division. The division includes the Physical Evidence Section, Special Investigations Section, North Texas Auto Theft Task Force; and the Warrants Execution Section. The responsibilities of each section focuses on a wide variety of crimes and are instrumental in finding and apprehending offenders.


o In 2021 this section seized **297,195** grams of cocaine; 1,666,569 grams of methamphetamine, and **\$1,197,124** in cash.

o In 2020, recovered 742 stolen vehicles worth an estimated value of \$9,753,318.00 o In 2021, recovered 905 stolen vehicles worth an estimated value of \$13,270,788.00

Warrant Execution Section

- o Served over 3,000 warrants in 2020

JUDICIAL SERVICES AND COMMUNICATIONS BUREAU

The Judicial Services and Communications Bureau consist of the Fugitive Unit, the Texas Department of Corrections Unit, Mental Health Unit, Communications Section, Writ Enforcement Section, and the Court Services Section.

o Fugitive Unit

Travels throughout the United States to bring fugitives who have warrants back to Dallas County

Transported **800** inmates from around the United States in **2020** Transported **1316** inmates from around the United States in **2021**

o TDC Unit

Responsible for transportion to and from the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. **In 2020**, we made **1536** trips.

In 2021, we made 1765 trips.

o Mental Health Unit

Responsible for transportation of inmates who have mental health issues to and from courts and detention facilities. This unit also serves mental health summons.

o Communications Section

Call-takers and dispatchers operate sophisticated communication systems. The systems are referred to as Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD), radio systems, multi-line telephone console system, alerting system; and the Telecommunications Device for the Deaf (TDD).



JUDICIAL SERVICES AND COMMUNICATIONS BUREAU CONTINUED...

o Writ Enforcement Section

A writ is defined as a form of written command in the name of a court or other legal authority to act, or abstain from acting in some way. The Writ Enforcement Section receives several types of writs such as tax warrants, writs of execution, bond forfeitures, and bank warrants.

o Court Services Section

Bailiff Section- Primary function is the security of the courtrooms and all occupants. The Sheriff's Department currently provides bailiffs to the following locations


