## WHAT DOES DALLAS COUNTY PROCURE?

#### **Professional services**

Legal, Architectural, Engineering, etc.

#### **Goods & Services**

Promotional items, IT, pest control, armored car services, grounds maintenance, janitorial goods and services, security, plumbing, HVAC, mechanical parts and services, uniforms, food, temporary staff, office supplies and furniture, etc.

#### Construction

Job Order Contracting, roofing, new construction, building repair, flooring, refurbishing, etc.

## METHODS OF PURCHASING

The County is governed by State of Texas purchasing statutes.

#### IFQ - Invitation for Quotes

- lowest vendor meeting minimum requirement

#### **RFB** – Request for Bids

- solicitations greater than \$50,000
- Two week advertising required
- lowest bidder meeting minimum requirement
- Commissioners Court required

#### RFQ – Request for Qualifications, solicitations greater than \$50,000

- Solicitations greater than \$50,000
- Two week advertising required
- Professional Services (only)
- Two step process based on qualifications
- Qualified vendor(s)
- Negotiations
- Commissioners Court required
