Internship Criteria and Minimum Requirements

- Must be at least 17 years of age and currently enrolled in a degree seeking program.
- Must pass a Dallas County background check.
- Must be able to commit to a minimum of 16 hours per week.

Internship Application Process

To apply, prepare an application packet with the following components:

- One letter of interest that includes information about your background, future goals (career, graduate school, etc.), and research interests. The letter should include what you hope to gain from participating in the internship and details of your education and experience in forensic science or your related field of study.
- Current CV or resume
- Contact information for a professor we may reach out to for a reference *or* one letter of recommendation from an instructor, professor, or academic advisor.
