A Day at the Capitol

Imagine telling your daughter, son, grandkids, love ones, “Don’t worry about your college tuition. Don’t worry about a down payment. Here, this is for you,” as you provide them with the savings and investments you’ve built while being a Dallas County employee. The relief and peace of mind you feel knowing they won’t have to worry or stress about how they will make it until their next paycheck.

On Monday, April 14th Cynthia Hernandez, County Treasurer Pauline Medrano, and Joe Salas, Investment Compliance Officer of the Dallas County Treasurer’s Office testified before the Pension, Retirement and Financial Services House Committee. Joe reflected on what Nationwide has done for his family. He spoke in support to the House bill 2783, relating to automatic participation by certain county employees in deferred compensation plans provided by certain counties.

Joe started contributing to the Nationwide 457b account four years ago, when he first started with Dallas County. He started with 10% of his paycheck and has gradually increased it up to 24% between both accounts he has.

Nationwide 457b allows employees to contribute to two different accounts, a Roth IRA and/or a Traditional IRA. Both allowing employees to save and invest for retirement and generational wealth.
